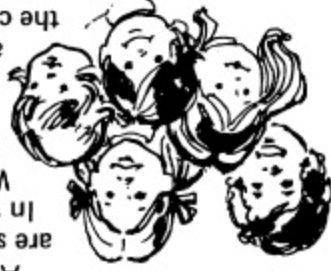


Jesus Said... "Let the children come to me"
